Day 1 – Find some inspiration for a story. If you are stuck for ideas, you can use an idea from the grid attached. Once you have decided on your story idea, plan and organise your ideas using headings a mind map, or the graphic organiser attached.

Day 2 – Work on your introduction. d Don't forget to include details about the characters in your story and the setting where your story takes place.

Day 3 – Work on your series of events. d Don't forget to use language features such as characterisation (description), rhyme, sound effects or dialogue in your story so the reader can picture what is happening in their head as they read.


Day 4 – Work on your conclusion. \oint Don't forget to tell the reader how your story ends.

Day 5 – Revise and edit your work. d Don't forget to check for appropriate structure, spelling, grammar and punctuation.




You become a character in your favourite video game, and....
