Please mindful of our neighbours

Unfortunately, we were notified by a neighbour this week, that parents have been parking both along and within their driveway. Please remember to be respectful of neighbouring properties and avoid parking in driveways. Please note the parking regulations that apply to driveways below:

Parking

Parking rules are designed to stop vehicles from parking where it would be dangerous or inconvenient for others.

General parking rules

You must not stop your vehicle (that is, bring it to a stop and either stay with the vehicle or leave it parked) in the following circumstances:

- Double parked (that is in the road alongside a car that is parked)
- On or across a driveway or footpath
- On a median strip or traffic island
- On footpaths and nature strips
- Between BUS STOP, BUS ZONE, TAXI STAND or TAXI ZONE signs
- In a safety zone or within 10 metres before or after a safety zone
- Within an intersection

Uniforms



Become a catechist in 2020!

We are in need of new scripture teachers. The following classes ARE without Catholic SRE teachers in 2020:

- Turramurra Public School: Wednesday 915-945am AND 1025-1105am for Year 6
- Gordon West Public School: Wednesday 1135-1210pm for Kindy, Year 3 and Year 6
- West Pymble Public School: Wednesday 1235-110pm for ALL YEAR GROUPS
- Pymble Public School: Wednesday 9-930am for Year 2 AND 930-10am Year 3 and Year 6.
- Turramurra High School: various days, times, and year groups.

Some of our classes are very large. *Even those classes with SRE teachers could also use an assistant. Can you help?* The original meaning of "catechist" is one who "echoes God's word", however catechists are much more than that. Facilitating a child's faith formation is a rewarding experience that does not require a teacher's degree or an advanced degree in theology: all it requires is enthusiasm, as well as generosity in sharing your time with others. Classes are once a week and run for 30-35 minutes. <u>Resources, lesson plans, teacher's manuals, student workbooks,</u> <u>support and training are provided free of charge.</u> Please contact me at <u>Melanie@pymblecatholicparish.org.au</u> for a commitment free discussion about how you can add value to our community's youth.



Australian Childhood Anxiety TREATMENT STUDY

Free home-based assessment and treatment for 7 to 12 year old children with fear and anxiety disorders.

Does your child become very afraid of certain situations or objects, worry about a lot of things, get very distressed, or try to avoid things they fear?

About the study

Our team at Griffith University may be able to assist you. We are conducting a nationwide study that includes the following services at no cost to families:

- A thorough assessment of your child's anxiety with a trained psychologist via the telephone;
- Your child receiving one of two kinds of homebased treatments delivered on a PC, laptop or tablet; and
- Two follow-up telephone assessments with a trained psychologist 6- and 12-months after treatment to track your child's progress.

The study aims to find out if these two treatments are as effective as each other, and which children have the best response to each kind of treatment. This will mean that there are more evidence-based treatments available for helping anxious children.

About the treatments

Each treatment involves your child completing treatment sessions at home on a PC, laptop or tablet.

Each treatment involves your child learning practical strategies to better manage anxiety.

- One treatment helps children learn to control the focus of their attention on helpful things around them.
- The other treatment helps children learn to think differently and approach things they fear.

Each treatment includes information, telephone or email support for parents in assisting their child to better manage anxiety.

Prior studies have shown that children who complete each treatment experience significant reductions in anxiety.
