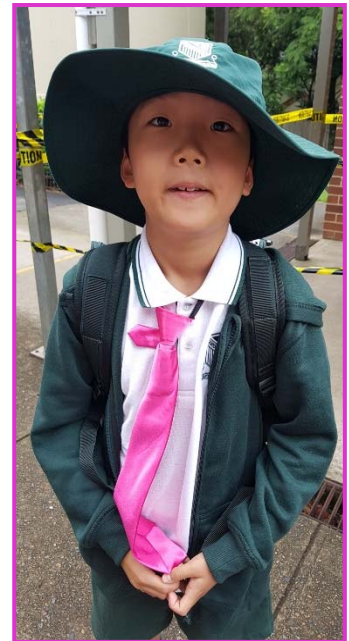

Ethics News

Could you be an Ethics teacher for Gordon East?

Some of our current ethics teachers are moving on and we are seeking volunteers so that classes can continue in 2019.

Ethics teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the ethics program. Training consists of a two day workshop and short online modules. Lesson materials are provided. Suitable volunteers have an interest in children's education and development of critical thinking skills and must be available from 9-9.45am each Tuesday during term.

In ethics classes, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Children discuss topic such as:

- imagining how others feel
- how do we treat living things?
- what is laziness?
- how do we disagree in a respectful way?
- fairness

Homework Club, Additional Activities Notifications: Homework club and additional activities forms are now available on the parents table.

Notifiable absences (Absent Missing Children procedure): If a child who is booked in to the Centre does not arrive after school, a staff member must find out why the child is not present. This usually involves making several phone calls and contacting school staff. In some cases, where no contact can be made with either a parent or emergency contact person, the Police are called. In each case, staff must also complete an absent and missing child report. Apart from the worry caused by non-notification of your child's absence, it is a costly, time consuming and potentially dangerous exercise to follow up absent children each afternoon. It can be avoided by each absence being reported to the Centre staff by you, the parent, in advance. To minimize expending valuable staff time spent on this task and to ensure the safety of all enrolled children, a fee of \$30 will be charged to each account where no notification of absence is received

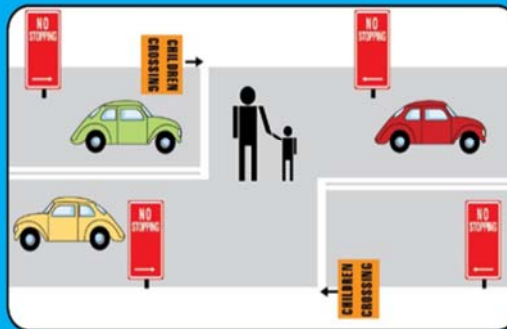

FOR DRIVERS

- This is only a part time crossing. It operates when orange 'CHILDREN CROSSING' flags are displayed.
- Drivers must stop at the solid white line and give way to any pedestrians on or about to use the crossing.
- You must not proceed until all pedestrians have completely cleared the crossing.
- When approaching a crossing drive at a speed at which you can stop safely.
- Never stop in the No Stopping zones on either side of the crossing.

CHILDREN'S CROSSINGS



Crossing supervisors may be present at some crossings around schools. Please follow their instructions as they are there to keep children safe.

FOR PEDESTRIANS

- Ensure that drivers in both directions have seen you and have stopped before crossing.
- Walk between the two red and white posts.
- When flags are not displayed on a children's crossing you do not have right of way unless combined with a pedestrian crossing.
- Do not loiter and chat on or near a crossing. This is dangerous, can confuse motorists and holds up traffic.

Stop on or near children's crossing
– fine exceeds \$448 + 2 demerit points.

Proceed at children's crossing while pedestrian at crossing
– fine exceeds \$561 + 4 demerit points.

Pedestrian crosses the road within 20 metres of a crossing – fine exceeds \$75.

Pedestrian stays on crossing longer than necessary
– fine exceeds \$75.

These fines and demerit points apply in school zones and are current at time of printing February 2019

School Crossing Supervisors – Work with your community
1 x Casual position – Ku-Ring-Gai Local Government Area (00006T4E)

An important person in a child's school life is the School Crossing Supervisor, who ensures they cross the road safely. The role requires minimal hours out of your day and gives something worthwhile back to the community.

The hours are usually 8:00am to 9:30am and/or 2:30pm to 4:00pm Monday to Friday during school terms. You may be required to work morning, afternoon, both shifts and no shifts. As a casual you will be filling in for existing part-time staff and on call basis as required. The base rate is \$23.02 - \$27.62 per hour.

All the qualifications you need are community spirit, good communication skills, an alert and professional attitude to work and a reliable personality. The casual hours and school holidays would suit a parent or grandparent, a retiree or anyone wanting meaningful work — but not full-time.

Training for your key responsibilities of directing traffic to stop at the designated crossing and giving clear instructions to infants and primary school students to cross the road safely, will be provided. You may be required to attend a health assessment. Appointment is subject to a Working with Children Check clearance.
