At the school, we are seeing an increasing amount of applications for Extended Leave – travel. Just a reminder to parents that absences for reasons such as holidays are not encouraged. Should there be extenuating circumstances, parents are required to complete an Extended Leave – Travel form for all absences longer than 5 school days. This should be submitted at least two weeks prior to the leave beginning and include travel documentation as well as detailed reasons for the travel. Applications for Extended Leave – Travel, are unable to be accepted after departure and students will be entered as an unexplained absence on the roll.
