Dear Parents,

As you will have read last week, further restrictions are being lifted over the next few weeks. This means some school activities will be resuming. Please refer to the Parent Guidelines Information booklet sent out via School Stream and email out last Friday for further details on current guidelines and also which activities are being considered in term 3. I have included below some more information about some of these activities. Please note, with each of these activities there are strict guidelines that need to be followed in order to enable their recommencement. Your support with this is appreciated.

Assemblies – Our formal Tuesday afternoon assembly remains on hold. However, this week we recommenced our outdoor lines assembly. This is a short assembly, which allows us to communicate any messages with all students collectively.

Choir – Choir recommences next week (week 9). Parents are reminded to leave their children at the gate each morning and not enter the school grounds should your child be in a before school choir group.



School Vision

Gordon East Public School is a welcoming and collaborative school community that supports high quality learning. Quality teachers inspire students to be creative and critical thinkers enabling them to become active and informed global citizens.

Band and String Groups – Band, Strings and tutorials will recommence in term 3. Students must leave parents at the gates and bring their own instruments to the rehearsal each time.

PSSA - PSSA inter school competition will commence early in Term 3. We will be holding non-contact trials for each individual winter sport. Due to the current restrictions, these trials will be non-contact and more skill based.

Athletics Carnival – Due to the current restrictions there will be no Zone Athletics Carnival, hence our carnival is also cancelled. We hope to organise a school based carnival later in the year, should further restrictions be lifted in the future.

For all activities, hygiene guidelines continue to apply:

Stay at home when unwell. Only return to school when you have fully recovered.

Wash your hands regularly and thoroughly. Wash your hands or use hand sanitiser.

Maintain respiratory hygiene. Cover your cough or sneeze through coughing or sneezing into your elbow or tissue, and then disposing of tissues immediately. Always wash your hands after you have coughed, sneezed or blown your nose.

Student Illness

Thank you to the parents who continue to keep their children at home when unwell. Just a reminder that this applies to all signs of illness including upset stomachs, headaches, coughs or sniffles as well as respiratory illness. This will assist in helping to prevent spread within the school.

Intention To Apply For Year 5 Entry To An Opportunity Class In 2021

Opportunity classes can provide intellectual stimulation by grouping together high potential and gifted students who may otherwise be isolated from a suitable peer group. Successful students will usually have to leave their current school to enrol in a school with an opportunity class for Years 5 and 6.

Testing and assessment

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered on the results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test. Students who wish to be considered for opportunity class placement will sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on **Wednesday 16 September 2020**.

How to apply

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2021, you need to apply between **Tuesday 9 June 2020** and **Friday 26 June 2020**. You will need to access the online application at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5> . You must **not** use the child's email address.

If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the High Performing Students Team for assistance after **9 June 2020**. Contact details can be found on the web site shown below.

You must submit only **ONE application** for each student.

Important – the school cannot apply on your behalf.

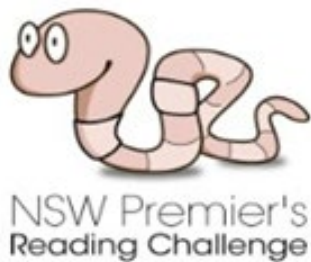
The Premier's Reading Challenge – 5 Bonus Choice Books

**Uniform Shop**

For the foreseeable future, we will require people to buy new uniforms online via Flexischools and second hand uniforms at the shop by appointment only. At this stage we will only use Tuesday morning for these appointments, subject to demand. Note the cut-off for Flexischools is 4.30pm Monday afternoon.

To buy second hand uniform:

Book a time slot (<https://www.picktime.com/GEPSUniformShop>) [Tuesdays for remainder of the term].

1. Come at your allocated time slot only – you will not be permitted to enter the school grounds if you don't have a booking.
2. Pre-fill out an order form with your name and payment details (attached) and bring with you.
3. Once at the shop, we will ask you to sanitise your hands and put on a pair of gloves prior to looking through the uniforms.
4. Payment will be via credit card only.

New uniform sales will be given to the office to pass to your child's class.
