Don't forget

Being the time of the year it is, we are commencing our planning and organisation for 2021. To assist us, please don't forget to submit the following ASAP.

- Kindergarten enrolments: Enrolments for Kindergarten 2021 are now being accepted. Children born between 1 August 2015 and 31 July 2016 are eligible to enrol. Parents wishing to enrol a child for school next year should submit their enrolment forms as soon as possible.
- Planning for 2021: If you are planning on leaving Gordon East PS at the end of 2020 from Kindergarten to Year 5 please let the office know in writing by completing the form included in the newsletter. This information helps with class organization and planning for 2021.

Road safety

I have recently noticed some parents doing U-turns directly out the front of the school. Whilst it may add a few minutes to your travel time to go an alternate route, for the safety of our students, please avoid performing U-Turns in and around school zones.



Why should U-turns and 3-point turns be avoided in school zones?

- · U-turns and 3-point turns are especially dangerous when performed in school zones as there is a high concentration of children.
- · Children are at risk because U-turns and 3-point turns are an unexpected manoeuvre and they cannot respond quickly to a sudden change in traffic conditions.
- · A sudden change in traffic conditions can cause them to become confused and panic.
- · A driver should choose an alternate route to avoid performing a U-turn or 3-point turn in a school zone.







Book a time slot (https://www.picktime.com/GEPSUniformShop) [Tuesdays for remainder of the term].

- 1. Come at your allocated time slot only you will not be permitted to enter the school grounds if you don't have a booking.
- 2. Pre-fill out an order form with your name and payment details (attached) and bring with you.
- 3. Once at the shop, we will ask you to sanitise your hands and put on a pair of gloves prior to looking through the uniforms.
- 4. Payment will be via credit card only.

New uniform sales will be given to the office to pass to your child's class.
