School Drop and Collection arrangements

School drop and collection arrangements remain the same. Parents and carers are asked to remain outside the gates and maintain social distancing guidelines at all times – stand 1.5 metres apart. Please use the space provided and keep moving up to collect your child. For Cameron Road pickup, please use the whole grassed space when waiting for your child and avoid crowding close to the bollards. Don't forget, please bring you child's name sign to assist staff with dismissal.

We also ask, to avoid crowding outside of the school at drop of and pick up, avoid gathering and chating in spaces that restrict movement and compromise social distancing measures in place. We appreciate your support with this.

Let's keep COVID-19 at a distance by keeping a distance.

COVID-19 Update

It has been exciting to have some activities able to recommence including:

- SRE & SEE
- Band, Strings, Ukulele and associated tutorials
- School Extra Curricula activities: dance, choirs & robotics club
- External Extra Curricula activities: French & Chess.
- PSSA & SISA
- Excursions to Department of Education Environmental Centres

As part of COVID-19 measures, all external providers are required to demonstrate compliance with health and safety requirements and Department of Education COVID-19 measures in place including adhering to strict guidelines and completing relevant forms.

Activities under consideration from Term 3

The following events will be reconsidered during Term 3. For now, these events will remain on hold:

- School camps
- Excursions
- Parent attendance at assemblies and other school events (e.g. graduation ceremonies or student speech events)
- Parent volunteers e.g. parent reading helpers
- Interstate excursions

School based activities that involve large gatherings of adults are not permitted at this time. These include parent/community gatherings such as parent functions, working bees, fundraisers, school BBQs, large parent information evenings, and large on-site cultural events. These large gatherings will continue to be reviewed and assessed based on AHPPC and NSW Health advice and may be permitted at a later date.

Visitors to the school

Please note, that, non-essential adults are still not permitted on school grounds or at school events; this includes parents and carers unless specifically approved by the principal. All visitors to the school must sign in to the office. This includes parents attending the uniform shop by appointment only or volunteering in the canteen. When singing in, all visitors are required to sign in and out as well as complete the External Visitors to School Site form.

Physical distancing

<u>Students</u>

School students do not need to follow strict adult physical distancing guidelines, but should continue to follow good hygiene practices like:

- regularly washing hands
- avoiding sharing drinks or food
- coughing or sneezing into your elbow, or a tissue which should be discarded immediately
- filling water bottles from bubblers rather than using the bubbler directly.

All classrooms have hand sanitiser and children continue to use hand sanitiser before they enter their classroom as well as before eating times.

Parents

Parents continue to be asked to observe social distancing guidelines. All adults must maintain physical distance from each other (1.5m).

School Cleaning and Hygiene Supplies

Our school continues to receive additional cleaning in line with the

AHPPC guidelines and advice from NSW Health. Target areas include high-touch areas and other hard surfaces, door handles, light switches and handrails in stairways and movement areas. The additional cleaning will continue during term 3.

Child protection

Each year as part of the NSW PDHPE syllabus, it is a requirement to teach Child Protection Education to all students in K-6. Below is an overview of what students learn about as part of child protection education. Should you not wish your child to participate in these lessons, please contact you class teacher.

Child protection education aims to assist students to develop skills to:

- recognise and respond to unsafe situations
- seek assistance effectively
- establish and maintain non-coercive relationships and strengthen attitudes and values related to equality, respect and responsibility.

Through Child Protection Education in NSW school students learn:

- about feeling safe and the right to be safe
- to recognise appropriate touching and inappropriate touching
- that appropriate touching is an important part of positive relationships
- that they have a right to say NO to a person who touches them inappropriately or threatens their safety
- that it is important to tell trusted adults about such situations
- that they may have to keep on telling people until they are believed
- that help is available to them within their communities.


Library News

Uniform Shop

For the foreseeable future, we will require people to buy new uniforms online via Flexischools and second hand uniforms at the shop by appointment only. At this stage we will only use Tuesday morning for these appointments, subject to demand. Note the cut-off for Flexischools is 4.30pm Monday afternoon.

To buy second hand uniform:

Book a time slot (https://www.picktime.com/GEPSUniformShop) [Tuesdays for remainder of the term].

- Come at your allocated time slot only you will not be permitted to enter the school grounds if you don't have a booking.
- 2. Pre-fill out an order form with your name and payment details (attached) and bring with you.
- 3. Once at the shop, we will ask you to sanitise your hands and put on a pair of gloves prior to looking through the uniforms.
- 4. Payment will be via credit card only.

New uniform sales will be given to the office to pass to your child's class.
