Dear Families,





### **Bike Safety**

Recently, we have seen a number of children being unsafe when riding bikes to and from school. Regular reminders and safety lessons are taught throughout the school year. Some bike safety tips that you can discuss at home are provided below.

Until they are at least 10 years old, your child should ride off-road away from vehicles and driveways. While your child may learn skills such as balancing, pedalling and steering quite easily, they are still learning skills that help them to judge speed, distance and the direction of sound. Your young child will often ride with their head



Your older child may want to ride to and from school. This helps to ease traffic congestion, reduce your carbon footprint and promotes physical activity.

### Safe riding tips

- Always wear an approved bicycle helmet, properly fitted and fastened
- Always obey the road rules, including traffic lights, stop signs and give way signs
- Always walk your bike across the zebra/children's crossings
- Allow pedestrians a metre of space on shared paths, where possible.
- Always travel at a speed that is safe for you and the pedestrians you encounter, especially if you are riding on a footpath or shared path
- When approaching pedestrians, always ring your bell, slow down and prepare to stop and give way
- Ride in a predictable manner so that other road users do not have to react suddenly to your movements
- Give hand signals when changing lanes or turning left or right
- Make yourself visible by wearing bright, light or reflective clothing
- Plan your route using quieter streets, bicycle paths or shared paths
- Always be in control of your bicycle. It is an offence to ride with both hands off the handlebars, feet off the pedals or to carry anything that prevents you from having control.

### **Enviromentors Workshops**

Well done to our Stage 2 classes who attended the Environmentors workshops this week. Our aim is to facilitate the development of students' knowledge, attitudes, skills and behaviour in relation to recycling, its products and social and environmental benefits. By learning about reducing natural resource, energy and water use, students are motivated, willing and able to adopt correct recycling actions and encourage others to do so. Students from Stage 2 have suggested the following ways for our school and broader community to improve our waste management habits

- 1. Start a worm farm or compost bin
- 2. Find ways to reduce, reuse, repurpose and recycle
- 3. Use reusable food containers

It's wonderful to see our students develop their understanding of the importance of looking after our environment. Such an important consideration for future generations.


















### **Stage 2 Life Story Project**

This semester, Stage 2 students participated in the LittleScribe My Life Story Project. Throughout the project students have worked with authors and illustrators like Cameron Daddo and James Foley. We have developed and refined our skills for creative writing, language techniques and illustrations. Students learn about the writing cycle whereby they had to draft, edit, revise and publish a story about their lives. The inspiration for their stories was characters and people.

The published books are ultimately the work of the individual students. Teachers offered writing mentoring and conferencing sessions throughout the process, however, did not change any stories without permission from the children. We encouraged students to accept feedback, make improvements and consider the implications for the final product. As such, the results reflect the varying levels of effort, pride and care taken to produce quality work. You may find that there are some misspelt words, slightly blurry pictures or other minor imperfections in their books.

Stage 2 students thoroughly enjoyed My Life Story project and are very proud that they are published authors and illustrators at such a young age. Please enjoy their work!



### **President Report**


Dear Families,

- 2. Pre-fill out an order form with your name and payment details (attached) and bring with you.
- 3. Once at the shop, we will ask you to sanitise your hands and put on a pair of gloves prior to looking through the uniforms.
- 4. Payment will be via credit card only.
