As we begin our plans for 2021 it is important that we have a clear idea of the number of students anticipated in each year group.


If you are expecting that your son or daughter will not be returning to Gordon East next year it would be greatly appreciated if you would indicate this as soon as possible.

To buy second hand uniform:

Book a time slot (<u>https://www.picktime.com/GEPSUniformShop</u>) [Tuesdays].

- 1. Come at your allocated time slot only you will not be permitted to enter the school grounds if you don't have a booking.
- 2. Pre-fill out an order form with your name and payment details (attached) and bring with you.
- 3. Once at the shop, we will ask you to sanitise your hands and put on a pair of gloves prior to looking through the uniforms.
- 4. Payment will be via credit card only.
