






#### GIRLS IN SCIENCE AT KILLARA HIGH SCHOOL



KSP Girls in Science workshop is an invitation for primary school students to develop their knowledge of basic Science. When creating bath bombs, the Year 4 students gained an understanding of chemical engineering as they needed to use the scientific method to determine the correct concentration of each ingredient. They were able to identify the necessary ingredients to generate the best bath bomb. The factors of colour, fizz and shape were kept in mind as they prepared their bath bombs. The successes were numerous despite minor incidents such as overflowing beakers, when they made bath bombs that were a little too fizzy!!

Additionally, the workshop consisted of working with water beads and their absorption of different water mixtures. The girls added the water beads into a mixture of water and other substances such as sugar, salt, and bicarbonate soda. The girls all observed how the bicarb soda slowed down the process of the beads growing and shared their observations with each other. All the girls discussed the safety risks in the classroom and the aim for the experiment. The Year 8 girls assisted with the experiments and guided them through writing aims and observations. All the girls had loads of fun helping each other and acting as role models for the younger students. The Year 4's had many questions and queries about the experiment and were super excited to learn about the subject.







There will also be an opportunity for parents to still be involved in the canteen ongoing, which our new provider Local Lunches will provide further information on shortly. Following an earlier communication this week, the next P&C meeting is the **Wishlist Meeting** scheduled for next **Tuesday 21st March 2032 at 7:30pm**.

Everyone is welcome to attend and both face to face & online access will be made available. The purpose of the meeting is to identify areas of focus and priority for our spending over the coming year. All of you are welcome to join and participate.

If you are not familiar with the Wishlist process, in summary:

- 1. A Wishlist of costed items that the P&C could contribute to is put together from a combination of requests from teaching staff, parents and the P&C committee (this includes you!)
- 2. We discuss and vote on these items at the Wishlist meeting, with prioritising of the items made on the night from A (high priority) to D (low priority)

Items are costed, so the P&C can estimate, based on fundraising of previous years, how much of the items we are likely to be able to fund.

3. Based on the financial contributions of this community, and fundraising initiatives throughout the year, we work towards funding all priority A items, then progressively fund the lower priority items where possible.


